Important Information about Early Admission

- Students applying to Harvard under Restrictive Early Action may not apply to any other private institution under an Early Decision, Early Action, or Restrictive Early Action plan, or to a binding early program at a public university.
- Students are welcome to apply early to any public university, military academy, or university outside of the United States under a non-binding program.
- Students may apply to other universities under their Regular Decision or Early Decision II programs.
- Students whose applications are deferred in the early round, they may apply to a binding early decision program at another college (i.e., Early Decision II).
- Students may apply for scholarships or special academic programs with an early deadline at another
 institution, public or private, if the timing is proven to be a necessary aspect for consideration, and the
 outcome is non-binding.
- Harvard will meet the full financial need of admitted students regardless of whether they apply Restrictive Early Action or Regular Decision.
