

Your Home from the Start The First-Year Residential Experience



First-year students live in one of 17 first-year dorms in Harvard Yard, eat meals in their own dining hall, and are matched with a team of residential, academic, and peer advisors who ensure nobody goes through the transition to college alone. After the first year, each student moves into a "House" and will live there for the next three years. These Houses are dorm complexes where students live, dine, study, plan events, and play intramural sports.



Why study the liberal arts?

Before students can help change the world, they need to understand it.
The curriculum challenges students' thinking by asking difficult questions and exploring unfamiliar concepts. Students have the opportunity to indulge in their passion for inquiry and discovery across disciplines.


What is the curriculum?

The flexible liberal arts and sciences curriculum ensures both broadspanning and focused scholarship opportunities. Of the 32 courses, approximately 1/3 will cover various disciplines, 1/3 will be dedicated to your Concentration, and 1/3 will be electives.

Why not study multiple fields?

Students make academic connections when studying similar material from different academic angles. Harvard encourages exploration, which might include secondaries, joint or double Concentrations, or language citations. You can also take courses at MIT, Berklee, and Harvard's professional schools.

Financial Aid

Beginning in the 2025-2026 academic year, Harvard College will be free (including tuition, fees, food, housing, and more) for students from families with annual incomes of \$100,000 and below with typical assets.

Students from families earning \$200,000 and below with typical assets will qualify for free tuition, plus additional aid. Many students from families earning more than \$200,000 will also qualify for aid.

Timeline of Financial Support

"Affordability" means more than tuition, housing, and food. Here are a few examples:

Pre-arrival:

\$2,000 Start-Up Grant for move-in expenses*

All 4 years:

Student events fund for campus events*

Breaks/holidays:

A travel allowance to/from campus is included in your financial aid budget

First winter:

Winter coat funding*

Summers:

Funding for study abroad / unpaid internships (available through other Harvard offices)

Junior year:

\$2,000 Launch Grant for career-related expenses*

Application Timeline*

- November 1: First-year Restrictive Early Action (REA) application and financial aid application* deadline
- Mid-December: Decision notification for firstyear REA applicants
- January 1: First-year Regular Action application deadline
- February 1: First-year Regular Action financial aid application deadline*
- March 1: Transfer application and financial aid application* deadline
- Late March: Decision notification for firstyear Regular Action applicants
 - Mid-June: Decision notification for transfer applicants
 - *Students can apply for financial aid at any point in the application process, after being admitted, after enrolling, or during their Harvard career. Financial aid deadlines listed above generally ensure that financial aid information will be available at the same time as the admissions decision release.
