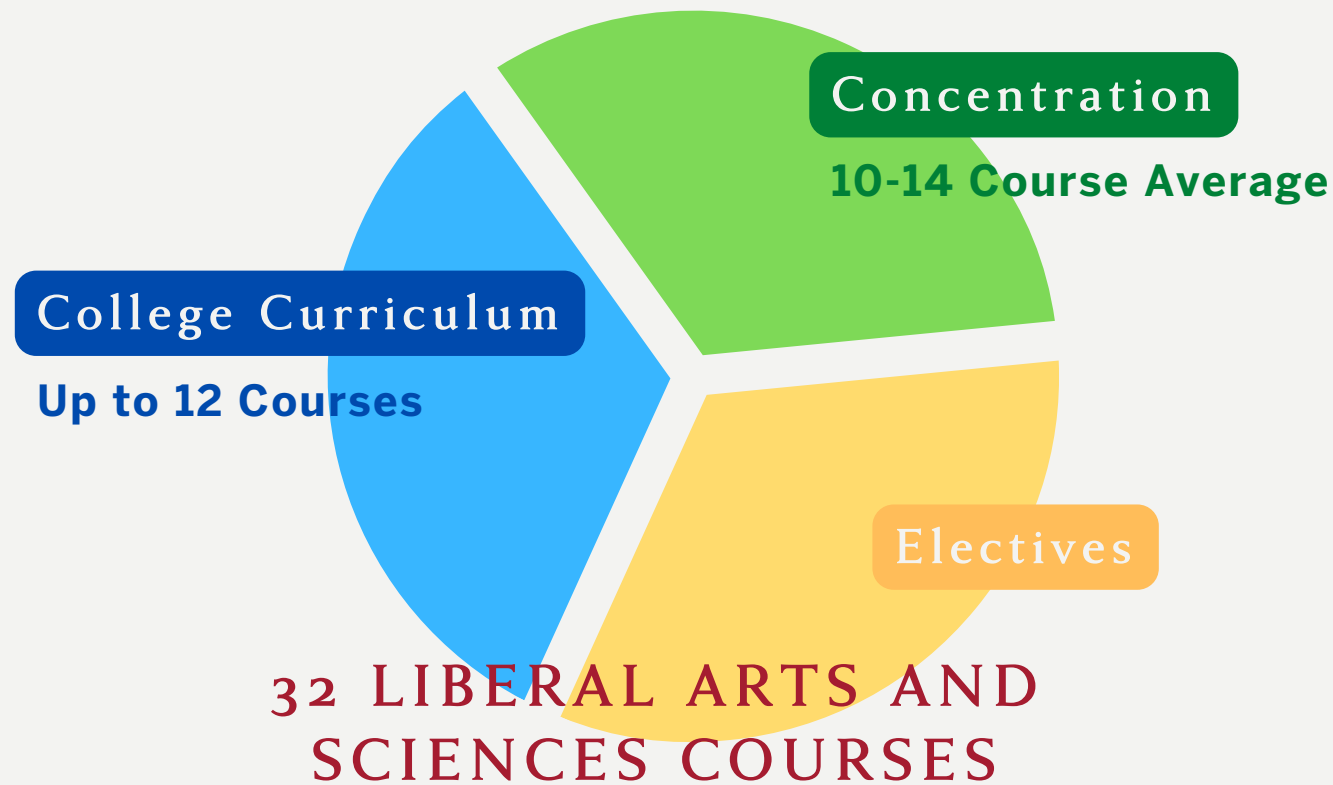

FINANCIAL AID & AFFORDABILITY

- Harvard financial aid is **need-based** and admissions is **need-blind**.
- **100%** of demonstrated need is met.
- There are no student loans required. 100% of students can graduate debt free.

IN OUR MOST RECENT ADMITTED CLASS:

- **26%** of Harvard college families pay nothing to attend.
- **45%** of students are tuition-free.
- **56%** of students receive financial aid.

\$100K* and under

Families with total incomes \$100k* and under **will pay nothing** to attend Harvard.

\$100K - \$200k*

Families with total incomes between \$100k-\$200k* **receive free tuition, with additional aid likely.**

\$200k* and over

Families with incomes above \$200k* **may still qualify for financial aid**, depending on individual circumstances.
